



## LandboNord

The effectiveness and health evaluation of livestock, in proportion to equivalent/corresponding productions under Danish conditions, and with overriding importance in relation to the rest of Europe's pig production.

The calculation is made for a full year from July 2011 to July 2012 and includes efficiency figures and veterinary expenses/costs.

## Estimation/Assessment of mortality

From the actual livestock herd 50% of pigs weighing 30kg are moved, while the other 50% stay in the same stables/stys from their beginning to the time they are slaughtered. This is a health advantage/benefit, which means, that Niels Christian Nielsen 'pigs' should be better than the average from - 7-30 + 30-100 kg. To get a more accurate comparison one can compare Niels Christian Nielsen's results with Mortality in similar pig 'productions' in Denmark. In the first half of 2012, the average mortality rate in the 13 herds that participated in the Benchmarking WTF herds was 4.5%. Collectively, based on the (Standard of references) Mortality rates are therefore pleasing/ encouraging.
